	Rigor: Dual Enrollment provides a rigorous opportunity for NHHS students to enroll in courses beyond what is available at the high school while also completing high school graduation requirements. Dual enrollment is not designed for every student. Some students do not qualify for early college admission due to a low core GPA and/or test scores. Dual Enrollment students are treated as adult learners and all correspondence is directed only to the student, not to the high school or to the parents.
	Scheduling: Full-time college attendance consists of enrollment if four 3-hour courses each semester. Taking less than a full-time college schedule requires that the student enroll in additional courses at NHHS. All students must be scheduled for a minimum of seven high school credits each year. Afternoon college classes may be taken later in the day, past 3:30. For traditional dual enrollment students, science is only approved when the student is on campus full time.
	Grades: Grades earned in Dual Enrollment courses will be included in the high school grade point average, the post-secondary grade point average (which will follow the student to future colleges) and the HOPE GPA calculation. Quality points are awarded for Dual Enrollment courses as follows: Core Academic Courses (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Modern Language) calculate at level 3 on the 5.0 scale. All other courses award quality points at Level 2 on the 4.5 scale. Letter grades will be converted to number grades on NHHS transcripts as follows: A+ (100), A (95), A- (90), B+ (89), B (85), B- (80), C+ (79), C (76), C- (74), D+ (73), D (72), D- (70), F (69)
	Withdrawing from a Course / Failing a Course: Withdrawal from or failure of any Dual Enrollment course may jeopardize high school graduation, sports eligibility, rank in class, and/or college admission to a future college or university. Earning a failing grade in a Dual Enrollment course may jeopardize the student's financial aid and/or HOPE scholarship eligibility. You must get the approval from your NHHS School Counselor prior to withdrawing from a Dual Enrollment course. The resulting open space must be filled with a similar NHHS course as determined by the NHHS administration.
	Transfer of Credit: Credits earned through Dual Enrollment may or may not transfer to another post-secondary institution. It is the responsibility of the student to inform themselves about the policies of each institution.
	Attendance: With the exception of required high school exams, Dual Enrollment students must choose college course attendance over activities at the high school. Any exceptions require prior notification of the college administrator and instructor.
	Extracurricular Consideration: Withdrawing from Dual Enrollment classes or earning failing grades can affect high school athletic eligibility. There are no minimum number of NHHS courses to be taken on campus for high school athletic eligibility.
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
